FINAL ORDER AND CONSENT AGREEMENT

NOW ON THIS 28 day of 2011, the Kansas State Board of Nursing, represented by Assistant Attorney General, Danielle R. Sanger, and the Respondent, Tamra M. Langford, hereby enter into this agreement and proffer evidence and the hearing officer adopts those recommendations and makes the following findings of fact and orders:

AGREED FINDINGS OF FACT

- Respondent is licensed to practice nursing in Kansas through 06/30/2013. The Kansas State Board of Nursing (KSBN) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and the subject matter of this action.
- 2. Respondent's address of record is 24807 W. Trailswest Rd., Plevna KS 67568.
- 3. The Respondent understands that pursuant to K.S.A. 77-515, Respondent may be represented, at Respondent's expense, by an attorney during these proceedings.
- Respondent acknowledges that this agreement is an open record pursuant to the Kansas Open Records Act, K.S.A 45-215 et seq., and may be published or disseminated.
- 5. The Kansas State Board of Nursing shall examine, license and renew licenses of duly qualified applicants under the authority of K.S.A. 74-1106 *et seq*. Under the authority of K.S.A. 65-1120, the Kansas State Board of Nursing may deny, revoke, limit or suspend a license or authorization to practice nursing or may issue a public or private censure

- and levy administrative fines, consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.
- 6. On or about 03/09/2006, the Board received information regarding Respondent, alleging that on or about 3/2/2006, Respondent called in unauthorized prescriptions and then tried to pick them up from the Dillons pharmacy in Hutchinson Kansas. Subsequently, case # 06-214-4 was opened.
- 7. On or about 8/27/2007, the Board received information regarding Respondent, alleging that on or about 7/27/2007, while employed at Summit Surgical, Hutchinson Kansas, Respondent failed to follow policy, resulting in a wrong site surgery on a patient. Subsequently, case # 07-810-4 was opened.

9. In a phone statement, given on 6/9/2006, Lisa Unruh, Registered Pharmacist at Dillons Pharmacy, Hutchinson Kansas, stated that Respondent called in a prescription for flexeril for her husband Donald and then called in a prescription for lortab for her husband Donald. Lisa Unruh stated that Respondent called the prescriptions in for Dr. Jackson's office, and she didn't work for Dr. Jackson's office. Lisa Unruh also stated that she recognized Respondent's voice because she was a nurse in a cardiology office, and the pharmacy had phone contact with Respondent 5-6 times a week, sometimes a couple or more times a day. Lisa Unruh stated she then called Dr. Jackson's office back since Respondent was not Dr. Jackson's nurse and was told that Dr. Jackson's office had not seen Donald Langford and had not ordered prescriptions for Donald Langford. Lisa Unruh stated that Respondent came through the drive through and tried to fill the prescriptions but was told by another pharmacy employee

that the pharmacy could not fill the prescriptions. Lisa Unruh stated that Respondent looked at the pharmacy employee in shock and just drove away.

- 10. In a statement dated 8/8/2007, regarding the wrong site surgery allegation in case # 07-810-4, Respondent stated, "I placed the tourniquet on the left leg and put the leg in the leg holder. I documented everything in the chart as left knee. No time-out was done. Charting was done during the procedure. I never saw markings on the right knee." (emphasis added)
- 11. Summit Surgical facility policy titled, "Surgical Site Identification," states:

Pre-Op Verification

- The pre-op nurse will have the patient/family mark the site/side with a marker prior to going into the operating room. The site will be marked with the patient's initials.
- The operating room nurse will ask the patient and/or family what surgery and what site/side is to be done. Do not ask a yes or no question.
- The anesthesia provider will ask the patient and/or family what surgery and what site/side is to be done.
- The surgeon will ask the patient and /or family what surgery and what site/side is to be done.

Verification of the surgery site/side markings will be documented on the pre-op record.

Intra-Op Verification

- The patient will be positioned, prepped, and draped prior to the operative site being verified by the anesthesia provider, surgeon, circulating nurse, scrub tech and assistant if applicable in the operating room.
- The circulating nurse will read aloud the operative consent.
- The anesthesia provider will verify the patient name by viewing the patient armband.
- The surgeon and scrub tech will verify the patient initials on the operative site and that the markings are visible after the drapes have been placed.

■ If all of the above are in agreement, the incision will be made.

The circulating nurse will document in the medical record that all staff present in the room were in agreement with the correct site/side and correct patient.

- 13. The above incidents are violations of the Nurse Practice Act. The Respondent agrees that the Board is prepared to prove that Respondent has violated:
 - a. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(a), performing acts beyond the authorized scope of the level of nursing for which the individual is licensed;
 - b. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(c), failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard each patient;
 - c. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(s), failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the board.
- 14. Respondent has the right to a hearing with evidence and witnesses and to seek review of the findings from that hearing in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act and the Judicial Review Act. Respondent is waiving those rights and voluntarily entering into this agreement instead of proceeding to such a hearing.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

15. The Kansas State Board of Nursing has the authority under K.S.A. 74-1106 *et seq.* to examine, license and renew licenses for duly qualified applicants and deny, revoke, limit or suspend a license or authorization to practice nursing, may issue a public or

private censure and levy administrative fines consistent with K.S.A. 74-1110, if a violation of K.S.A. 65-1120 is established.

- 16. Respondent has violated the Kansas Nurse Practice Act as follows:
 - a. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(a), performing acts beyond the authorized scope of the level of nursing for which the individual is licensed;
 - b. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(c), failing to take appropriate action or to follow policies and procedures in the practice situation designed to safeguard each patient;
 - c. K.S.A. 65-1120(a)(6): to be guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations of the board, by KAR 60-3-110(s), failing to complete the requirements of the impaired provider program of the board.

POLICY STATEMENT

17. The role of the Kansas State Board of Nursing is to protect the citizens of Kansas.

DISPOSITION

- 18. By entering into this Consent Agreement and consenting to the entry of the Final Order, both parties waive their right to full administrative proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 65-1120 and K.S.A.77-501 *et seq.* and to judicial review.
- 19. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that this Final Order and Consent Agreement will continue through any renewal periods of Respondent's nursing license until Respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement. Further, the parties agree that in the event of a lapse of Respondent's nursing license, reinstatement of Respondent's nursing license shall be contingent upon this Final Order

- and Consent Agreement remaining in effect until Respondent completes each of the conditions and requirements of this agreement.
- 20. Based upon this agreement, and pursuant to the disciplinary remedies available in K.S.A. 65-1120, the parties agree that the Respondent's license to practice nursing in Kansas is immediately suspended with a stay.
- 21. The Kansas State Board of Nursing will not take additional disciplinary action against Respondent's nursing license for the violations stated above as long as Respondent completes each of the following conditions and requirements:
 - a. Respondent's license is immediately suspended with a stay.
 - Respondent shall complete a 3-6 hour CNE on "Professional
 Accountability" and submit an original certificate of completion within 90
 days of the date of the Consent Agreement.
 - c. Respondent shall complete a 3-6 hour CNE on "Disciplinary Actions" and submit an original certificate of completion within 90 days of the date of the Consent Agreement.
 - d. Respondent shall complete a 5-10 hour CNE on "Nursing Errors" and submit an original certificate of completion within 90 days of the date of the Consent Agreement.
 - e. Respondent shall submit reports from the Respondent's employer to the attention of the Legal Division, Kansas State Board of Nursing, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Suite 1051, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1230 on the following schedule:
 - i. Prior to Respondent securing employment that utilizes his or her nursing license, Respondent is to mail to the Kansas State Board of Nursing a statement indicating that Respondent has not yet secured employment which utilizes Respondent's nursing license. This

- statement is due by the 10th day of each month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement.
- ii. Once Respondent is employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, or if Respondent is currently employed in a position that utilizes his or her nursing license, a nursing performance report is due by the 10th day of every third Month until Respondent has caused the submission of four (4) separate nursing performance reports. These reports are due by the 10th day of every third month beginning the next month after signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement.
- iii. The report shall be prepared and signed by Respondent's immediate supervisor or by an R.N. who evaluates Respondent's performance on a regular basis and be based on the following guidelines:
 - Incorporation of information on facility letterhead stationary is required.
 - 2. Letter format is acceptable, with the date of the report identified.
 - 3. Evaluator's name, telephone number, address, license number and nursing credentials.
 - 4. Respondent's name, address, telephone number, license number.
 - 5. A short explanation of the Respondent's work performance in the following areas:
 - a. Standards met regarding facility policies and procedures.
 - b. Compliance with the Kansas Nurse Practice Act.

- c. Supervisor evaluations.
- d. Overall appropriateness.
- e. Interactions with patients.
- f. Interactions with staff and administration.
- f. Respondent shall send a money order for \$70 to the Board upon entering into this agreement to pay the cost of this action.
- g. Respondent shall not violate the Kansas Nurse Practice Act during the duration of this agreement.
- h. Respondent shall not violate the laws of the United States, of any State, or of any political subdivision of any State during the term of this agreement. Traffic infractions shall not be considered violations of the law.
- Respondent agrees to notify the Legal Division of any changes in address and phone number as well as all employment terminations or employer changes or additions.
 - i. All such notifications shall be made in writing within fourteen (14) days of such a change.
- j. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that Respondent is responsible for the costs related to satisfying the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Respondent further acknowledges and agrees that to provide the Board with false information regarding compliance with this Final Order and Consent Agreement is a violation of this Final Order and Consent Agreement.
- 22. If Respondent does not meet these conditions and requirements, the Kansas State

 Board of Nursing may request additional sanctions against Respondent's license or

 application for a license. Respondent would be sent notice of such action and would be
 entitled to a hearing as to whether Respondent had complied with this Final Order and

- Consent Agreement, but Respondent could not contest the violations listed in this agreement.
- 23. All parties understand that if an action based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is filed, K.S.A. 77-531 requires the Notice of Hearing to be served upon the Respondent and the Respondent's attorney of record, if any.
- 24. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that if any notice based on failure to meet the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is filed during the term of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, or within 30 days after the expiration date, the conditions of this Final Order and Consent Agreement shall continue in effect until the Board takes final action in the proceeding.
- 25. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a first finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas, shall be lifted for a period of six months from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.
- 26. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon a second or subsequent finding of Respondent not complying with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement the Stay of Suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Kansas, shall be lifted for a period of one year from the date of said finding. Respondent will not be allowed to practice nursing in the state of Kansas during the period of suspension. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that all

- conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement remain in effect during the period of suspension.
- 27. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that upon the Stay of Suspension being lifted due to a finding of non-compliance with any of the conditions or requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement, the Suspension will not again be Stayed until the Respondent has, following the prescribed time period of suspension, provided written verification to the Board that Respondent is in compliance and has remained in compliance during the period of suspension, with all conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement. Upon the Respondent providing said written verification, the suspension will again be stayed.
- 28. This agreement does not prohibit the agency from taking disciplinary action against Respondent's license for any additional or cumulative violation of the Kansas Nurse Practice Act committed by the Respondent before or after this agreement is entered into.
- 29. This agreement is a discipline and must be reported on any future renewal or reinstatement applications. This agreement is a contract entered into by the parties to resolve an investigative case. The original of this agreement shall be placed in the Agency Record. This Agreement is a public record and will be reported to national disciplinary data banks.
- 30. After successful completion of all of the conditions and requirements of this Final Order and Consent Agreement by the Respondent, the Final Order and Consent Agreement will be satisfied and the case will be inactivated.
- 31. By signing this Final Order and Consent Agreement, Respondent acknowledges that
 Respondent has read and understands the entire document and agrees to be bound by
 its terms. This Final Order and Consent Agreement constitute the entire agreement of
 the parties and may not be modified except in writing and approved by all parties. The

- effective date of this Final Order and Consent Agreement is the date shown on the certificate of service.
- 32. The hearing/presiding officer whose signature appears below has been designated pursuant to K.S.A. 77-514 and K.S.A. 77-526 to act on behalf of the Board/agency head and to hear discipline cases on behalf of the Board/agency head and to render either initial orders or final orders, if by agreement of both parties, in those discipline cases.
