Pursuant to Section 54.1-2409 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, ("Code"), you are hereby given notice that your certificate to practice as a certified massage therapist in the Commonwealth of Virginia has been mandatorily suspended by the enclosed Order entered August 6, 2013. You are hereby advised that, pursuant to Section 54.1-2409.1 of the Code, any person who practices a profession or occupation after having their license or certificate suspended shall be guilty of a felony. Please return your certificate to Jay Douglas, Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Nursing, at the above address, immediately upon receipt of this letter.

Section 54.1-2409 of the Code further provides that you may apply to the Board of Nursing ("Board") for reinstatement of your certificate, and shall be entitled to a hearing not later than the next regular meeting of the Board after the expiration of sixty days from the receipt of such reinstatement application. You have the following rights, among others: to be represented by legal counsel, to have witnesses subpoenaed on your behalf, to present documentary evidence and to cross-examine adverse witnesses. The reinstatement of your certificate shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present of the Board of Nursing.

FINAL ORDER

This matter appeared before the Board of Massage Therapy at a duly-noticed public meeting on April 25, 2013 in Jacksonville, Florida, for a hearing not involving disputed issues of material fact pursuant to Respondent's Election of Rights requesting a hearing pursuant to Sections 120.569 and 120.57(2), Florida Statutes. Petitioner has filed an Administrative Complaint seeking disciplinary action against the license. A copy of the Administrative Complaint is attached to and made a part of this Final Order. Petitioner was represented by Elana Jones, Assistant General Counsel, Florida Department of Health. Respondent was not present.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Therefore, the Board adopts as its finding of facts the facts set forth in the Administrative Complaint.

COMMONWEALTH'S EXHIBIT

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based upon the Findings of Fact, the Board concludes the licensee has violated Section 480.041(1)(b), 480.046(1)(o), 456.072(1)(h) and (w), Florida Statutes.

The Board is empowered by Sections 480.046(2) and 456.072(2), Florida Statutes, to impose a penalty against the licensee. Therefore it is ORDERED that:

The licensee must pay investigative costs of \$48.96 within 30 days of the date this Final Order is filed. Payment shall be made to the Board of Massage Therapy and mailed to Department of Health, Compliance Management Unit, Post Office Box 6320, B# C-76, Tallahassee, FL 32320, ATTN: Board of Massage Therapy Compliance Officer.

The license of HENG PING PENG is REVOKED.

This Final Order shall become effective upon filing with the Clerk of the Department of Health.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

COMES NOW, Petitioner, Department of Health, by and through its undersigned counsel, and files this Administrative Complaint before the Board of Massage Therapy against the Respondent, Heng Ping Peng, L.M.T., and in support thereof alleges:

- 1. Petitioner is the state agency charged with regulating the practice of massage therapy pursuant to Section 20.43, Florida Statutes (2012), and Chapters 456 and 480, Florida Statutes (2012).
- At all times material to this Complaint, Respondent was licensed as a massage therapist in the State of Florida, having been Issued license number MA 64898.
- 3. Respondent's address of record is 66 Dydo Drive, Uncasville, Connecticut 06362.

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- 4. On or about July 1, 2011, Respondent submitted an Application for Massage Therapist License ("Application") to the Florida Department of Health Board of Massage Therapy ("Florida Board").
- 5. On her Application, Respondent indicated that she graduated from Florida College of Natural Health ("FCNH") on July 1, 2011.
- 6. Pursuant to Section 480.041(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2011), in order to qualify for licensure as a massage therapist in the State of Florida pursuant to Chapter 480, Florida Statutes, a person must complete a course of study at a board-approved massage school or complete an apprenticeship program that meets the standards adopted by the board.
- 7. Submitted to the Florida Board with Respondent's Application was a transcript from FCNH.
- 8. The FCNH transcript represents that Respondent earned five hundred credit hours in the FCNH Professional Massage Therapy Program.
- 9. The FCNH transcript indicates that Respondent started the FCNH Professional Massage Therapy Program on February 7, 2011, and completed the program on July 1, 2011.
- 10. Also submitted with Respondent's Application was a FCNH Certificate of Completion of five hundred hours of Therapeutic Massage Training Program dated July 1, 2011.

11. On or about July 19, 2012, the Vice President of Compliance and Institutional Effectiveness for FCNH certified that the transcript and certificate submitted by Respondent with her Application are fraudulent.

12. Having not completed courses at, or obtained certificates of completion from, a Florida Board approved school, as required by Section 480.041(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2011), Respondent is not qualified to be licensed, or practice, as a massage therapist in the State of Florida.

COUNT ONE

- 13. Petitioner realleges paragraphs 1 through 12, as if fully set forth herein.
- 14. Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), subjects a massage therapist to discipline for violating any provision of Chapter 480 or 456, Florida Statutes, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto.
- 15. Section 456.072(1)(h), Florida Statutes (2011), subjects a massage therapist to discipline for attempting to obtain, obtaining, or renewing a license to practice a profession by bribery, by fraudulent misrepresentation, or through an error of the department or the board.
- 16. Based on the foregoing, Respondent has violated Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), by obtaining her license to practice massage therapy in the State of Florida through error of the Department of

Health or through fraudulent misrepresentation by submitting a fraudulent transcript and a fraudulent Certificate of Completion with her Application, in violation of Section 456.072(1)(h), Florida Statutes (2011).

COUNT TWO

- 17. Petitioner realleges paragraphs 1 through 12, as if fully set forth herein.
- 18. Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), subjects a massage therapist to discipline for violating any provision of Chapter 480 or 456, Florida Statutes, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto.
- 19. Section 456.072(1)(w), Florida Statutes (2011), subjects a massage therapist to discipline for failing to comply with the requirements for profiling and credentialing, including, but not limited to, falling to provide initial information, falling to timely provide updated information, or making misleading, untrue, deceptive, or fraudulent representations on a profile, credentialing, or initial or renewal licensure application.
- 20. Based on the foregoing, Respondent has violated Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), by for failing to comply with the requirements for profiling and credentialing by submitting a fraudulent transcript and a fraudulent Certificate of Completion with her Application for

licensure as a massage therapist in the State of Florida, in violation of Section 456.072(1)(w), Florida Statutes (2011).

COUNT THREE

- 21. Petitioner realleges and incorporates by reference the allegations in paragraphs 1 through 12 as if fully set forth herein.
- 22. Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), subjects a licensee to discipline for violating any provision of Chapter 480 or Chapter 456, or any rules adopted pursuant thereto.
- 23. Pursuant to Section 480.041(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2011), in order to qualify for licensure as a massage therapist in the State of Florida, a person must complete a course of study at a Florida Board-approved massage school or complete an apprenticeship program that meets the standards adopted by the Florida Board.
- 24. Respondent is not qualified to hold a license as a massage therapist because she falled to complete a course of study at a Florida Board-approved massage school and falled to complete an apprenticeship program that meets the standards adopted by the Florida Boar
- 25. Based on the foregoing, Respondent violated Section 480.046(1)(o), Florida Statutes (2011), by obtaining a license as a massage therapist without completing a course of study at a Florida Board-approved

massage school or an apprenticeship program that meets the standards adopted by the Florida Board, in violation of Section 480.041(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2011).

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WHEREFORE, Petitioner respectfully requests that the Board of Massage Therapy enter an order imposing one or more of the following penalties: permanent revocation or suspension of Respondent's license, restriction of practice, imposition of an administrative fine, issuance of a reprimand, placement of Respondent on probation, corrective action, and/or any other relief that the Board of Massage Therapy deems appropriate.
